Session 3 Romans 3:21-5:21

Man's Faith and God's Justification

Since both Jew and Gentile alike are to be judged for their sinful condition, and since even the Jews, who have the Law, cannot be justified by works of the Law, how then is it possible for any man to be counted righteous before God? Faith in Jesus Christ is the key. Such faith establishes the believer as justified before God.

Of course, the Law was not a hoax, but it was never intended to save, rather to point to the need for salvation through faith. In chapter four Paul draws upon Abraham as an exemplar of the kind of faith required, even by the Jews. Since justification is achieved by faith, righteousness is available to Jews and Gentile alike, on an equal basis. Both are recipients of God's grace.
