Session 6. Romans 8:1-39

True Implication: Justification is a Spiritual Truth

In this section Paul develops a true image of the believer's position, obligation, anticipation and motivation in Christ under grace through faith. It is a *position of righteousness*, vouchsafed by the Holy Spirit. It is an *obligation of gratitude* communicated by the Holy Spirit. It is in *anticipation* of the glory that the future holds. It is a *motivation of encouragement*, mediated by the Holy Spirit, through whom we are affirmed in our own spirit that we are truly beloved of God.
